





Join Europe's Circular Transformation – Empowering Macedonian Industry through Innovation and Funding Opportunities

Gala event: Innovation in circular economy and creative industries (28 October 2025)

Venue: Boris Trajkovski Sport Hall, Skopje, N. Macedonia

Description:

North Macedonia stands at the threshold of a new industrial transformation. The **Business Accelerator UKIM**, on behalf of the **EIT Community in North Macedonia**, has launched a 2025 initiative aimed at **strengthening the country's circular economy by connecting industry, academia, and policymakers and helping companies unlock access to European and national funding opportunities. In partnership with leading universities and research centres, new laboratory projects and innovation initiatives are advancing recycling technologies, waste valorisation, and sustainable materials**, paving the way for a more competitive and circular Macedonian economy.

As part of this initiative, the Gala Event will **Discover**, **Connect**, and **Shape the Future of Sustainable Growth in North Macedonia** by gathering **local and European experts**, **entrepreneurs**, and **decision-makers** to showcase practical solutions and inspire the **Macedonian industry** to integrate circularity into their operations. The event will spotlight available financial instruments from the **European Institute of Innovation and Technology (EIT)**, a body of the European Union, and national programmes supporting circular transformation, encouraging Macedonian companies, startups, and municipalities to **take action**, apply for funding, and scale sustainable innovations.

Co-organised by the <u>French Institute in Skopje (IFS)</u> and the <u>Macedonian Association of Metal and Electrical Industry (MAMEI)</u>, and held as a combined event with <u>EnergoTehnoma (27–30 October 2025)</u>, the programme will feature international, French, and Macedonian experts sharing best practices and successful examples of industrial circularity.

The event will include an opening ceremony and five thematic panels, featuring over 40 distinguished speakers presenting the latest industrial applications, creative innovations, and funding mechanisms driving the circular economy forward. Discussions will run from 10:30 to 17:00, followed by a networking session (17:00–18:00) offering participants the opportunity to connect directly with international guests, experts, and potential investors.

A dedicated session will introduce the <u>Western Balkans Circular Economy Hub</u> with aim of strengthening regional cooperation, enhancing transparency, and positioning Macedonian industry as a driver of sustainable growth and innovation.

Target Audience

Leaders from the Macedonian cement, steel, construction, textile, glass recycling, and manufacturing sectors; startups and entrepreneurs developing circular and creative solutions; EIT-supported ventures; academia and researchers focused on sustainability and materials science; creative professionals in fashion, design, and digital art; public institutions and policymakers; international organisations, civil society, and investors supporting green transition and innovation in the Western Balkans.
